

Hepatitis 102: Exploring Hepatitis with Health Care Providers, is a workshop developed by health professionals, for health professionals. This workshop explores the basics of Hepatitis A, B, and C, including symptoms, transmission routes, testing, and treatment. More importantly, Hepatitis 102 also examines the physical, emotional, and social impacts of Hepatitis, and delves into the challenges and stigma faces by those living with Hepatitis. The workshop also looks at what participants (as health care professionals) can do to lessen stigma, and provide empathetic care for those with Hepatitis.



The Hepatitis 102 workshop is ideal for health care professionals (nurses, phlebotomists, continuing care assistants, etc...), and health care professionals in training. Also, mental health workers (group home workers, shelter workers, addictions counsellors, etc...), and mental health workers in training.

The Hepatitis 102 workshop is designed to run between 50 and 75 minutes, and is best suited for a small group (between eight and twenty participants), but can be adapted for seminar style for larger groups.
